Executive Summary:			
<p>The current Refuse and Recycling contract with LRS included two alternate options to provide services beyond the base contract. One alternate service was to provide Sunday solid waste and recycling collection within the central business district on an annual basis. The City Council discussed the possibility of the Sunday collection but requested a quote for a monthly in lieu of an annual basis. LRS has provided a quote for the Sunday collection at \$4,621/per month. A second alternate service was to provide dry-cell battery recycling for the community at the Public Works Facility. In the previous contract, this service was provided at no fee, but a fee is included in the new contract. The fee is calculated on previous experiences of filling two- 35-gallon carts on a weekly basis of expired batteries.</p> <p>The collection period for both alternate services would be for the months of September, October, November, and December 2023 with renewal authorization requested on an annual basis.</p>
