



Prescription Drug Disposal Guidelines

- 1) Please double check this list to determine if you have brought in any items that cannot be collected. Please take any **unacceptable items** back with you.

Non-Controlled DEA Drugs Medication Samples Prescription Medications Over-the-counter Medications Medicated Ointments/Lotions Vitamins Medications for Pets Inhalers	Thermometers Any Illegal Substances/Narcotics DEA Controlled Drugs IV Bags Sharps/Needles Bloody or Infectious Waste Empty Containers

- 2) Present valid proof of Geneva residency to a records specialist at the front window and obtain plastic bags for any pills, ointment tubes, etc.
- 3) Remove all pills from their original container (except blister packs) by pouring them directly into a plastic bag. All ointments, liquids, etc. can be placed into a plastic bag in the original container. Blister packs can be submitted without being placed in a plastic bag.
- 4) Give all medications for disposal to the records specialist.
- 5) Take any empty items (prescription bottles, plastic bottles, boxes, etc.) with you, especially any item with your personal information on it.
