




Any resident, whose permanent residence is located within the area described in the downtown residential permit parking area map, or schedule XIII, section 7-4-13, of the City of Geneva Code of Ordinances, upon submission of [an application](#) and supporting documentation to the Police Department, may be issued a residential vehicle privilege parking permit. The resident is authorized to park their vehicle on the street and in the block where the resident lives without regard to posted maximum parking hour limits.

Upon approval of application, a residential vehicle parking permit will be issued and must be displayed upon the rearview mirror within the interior vehicle passenger compartment. Downtown residential vehicle parking permits are valid only in the areas described in the downtown residential parking permit map. The permits are valid for one year from date of issue. Renewal applications must be submitted and approved on an annual basis following initial issuance of permit.

Residential vehicle parking permits will only be issued to residents with a vehicle registered at a City of Geneva residential address. Residential vehicle parking tags are nontransferable to any other person or vehicle. Violators of the provisions of this section are subject to revocation of the residential vehicle parking permit. Any person whose residential vehicle parking permit has been revoked shall not be eligible for the issuance of any subsequent permit.


Permits issued under this section are not a guarantee of a parking space and are not transferable, nor shall the immunity granted thereby be applicable to any other restriction on parking, including, but not limited to, no parking zones, crosswalks and driveway entrances.

No immunity from overtime parking shall be allowed unless a vehicle displays a residential vehicle parking permit.
